#### Luke 24: 36b-48

36b ... Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." 37 They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. 38 He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? 39 Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." 40 And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. 41 While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" 42 They gave him a piece of broiled fish, 43 and he took it and ate in their presence.

44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you — that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, 46 and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, 47 and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things.

#### 1 John 3: 1-7

1 See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. 2 Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. 3 And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

## Sermon - Peace be with you

A young woman, Jill, was passionate in wanting to help young children and their families. She ran an after-school program and in it she built a close connection to one young boy in particular. She was invited to a meal at his home

one day and so brought flowers. When she arrived, the young boy met her at the door and told her she could not come in as his mum was drunk. The young woman froze and didn't know what to do. She quickly handed the boy the flowers and proceeded to leave. She left feeling helpless and guilty that she should've done something to help, that she let the boy down. She had come wanting to be a positive influence and to make a further connection that may have helped the family.

Later, in reflecting on the situation, Jill recognized that she had encountered the mother in a degraded state. She became aware of the shame of the boy and his mother. She questioned, how can she bring hope and be a blessing in the midst of such degradation?

With further thought, she began to wonder about her understanding of her faith. For Jill, the Jesus she knew was someone of joy, blessing and beauty. How can such a one encounter such degradation and shame? She continued to wonder if she had ever heard or noticed Jesus in states of degradation.

Jill remembered then the stories of the cross, Jesus touching lepers and being accused himself of being a drunk. She gradually realised that her understanding of Jesus and her faith needed to change and grow. Her experience had challenged her faith and invited new insight.

As Protestants, we don't like images of a distorted or degraded Christ. We like to emphasise the victory of the resurrection, the life given to the dying and the healing offered to the sick. We look to the Christ who fixes our failings and overcomes our despair.

When we hit the hard times, we cry out to the victorious Christ, the risen one and we become blind to the crucified suffering Christ standing beside us speaking quietly, soothingly to us, "peace; peace be with you."

The reality is it is hard to learn and hear God when fear dominates. So in this space we see that Jesus comes, recognises our fear and seeks to gather it in compassion. The crucified one understands. The crucified one does not expect us to respond the "right way". The crucified one knows we need to learn and grow.

This is what we encounter even when we read the resurrection stories. Jesus constantly meets the disciples, the women and all those he meets along the way in their fear and grief, gradually revealing himself showing his wounded hands, side and feet. He does not hurry them. He helps them understand, greeting them with peace.

The wounded Jesus, does not judge. The wounded Jesus, stands quietly beside us. The wounded Jesus, does not demand. The wounded Jesus, has a gentle touch.

In standing beside us in peace, Jesus brings comfort. It is in this space that life can take root. It is like the gentle planting of a seedling. It allows the roots to take and the plant to grow.

A person in grief often just needs the warm embrace of a friend. Words may not come and may not be needed. The quiet sharing of sorrow becomes a burden shared.

In our journey together through the changes we face as a new congregation, it will be the listening ear that will provide the greatest insights.

May you see the wounded hands and side and hear the word of peace.
